



Bundesministerium Kunst, Kultur, öffentlicher Dienst und Sport *Tattooing the Earth* is a collective mapping developed by artist group Freundliche Mitte. It centres around the landscape as a mirror of ownership structures, democratic and anti-democratic spaces, as a place of remembrance and sedimentation. Conceived as a walk-in installation, *Tattooing the Earth* feels its way along the surface of the earth, through colliding plates and habitats. Through disappearance. The result is a non-linear narrative assembled from bits and pieces that is continued and rewritten together with accomplices. Which memory remains, which counts?

Someone notes down what they experience, for the record, to defy the shifting of events, the memories that unfold and superimpose each other, break in and break up. It's a record that attempts to capture an eluding, shifting, dissolving present. It's the record of a peregrination through colliding landscapes, along the boundaries of tectonic plates, over white surfaces, vanished territories. It's the protocol of someone's own disappearance, from the landscape, from memories, from language. Which memory remains, which counts?

Tattooing the Earth is being created as a non-linear narrative assembled from bits and pieces, information, lies, and fiction, all continued and rewritten together with accomplices. A walk-in essay that keeps being written thus evolves at brut nordwest, with workshops and talks enhancing it. Perspectives are flexible, their images always incomplete, always moving.

The performance collective **Freundliche Mitte** was established in 2011 by writer **Gerhild Steinbuch**, set designer **Philine Rinnert** and actor **Sebastian Straub** as part of a joint project at steirischer herbst. The collective has chosen to work without the authority of a director. It constantly grows by new accomplices from different artistic and scientific fields such as architecture and music and collaborates with experts from various initiatives and societies. Since 2018, Freundliche Mitte have been working closely with Vienna-based musician **b.fleischmann**. Joint works include: *Am Schönsten ist das was bereits verschwunden ist* (steirischer herbst, Graz, 2011), *Previously On* (Garage X, Vienna, 2014), *Finsternis* (brut Wien, 2016), *BERGEINS* (brut Wien, 2018), *Oratorio Europa* (brut Wien, 2019), *Sportplatz Europa* (brut Wien, 2021). www.freundlichemitte.com

Open Archive (installation) / *Protocolling Demolition* (talk) With Katrin Hornek and Elisabeth Schäfer / Moderated by Alexander Kerlin

Installation & talk accompanying the performance Tattooing the Earth

In the context of the talk *Protocolling Demolition*, the philosopher **Elisabeth Schäfer** and the artist **Katrin Hornek** talk about the work on and with break-ins in the materiality of the earth, along critical contact zones.

Katrin Hornek studied performative art and sculpture at the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna and the Royal Danish Academy of Fine Arts. Katrin Hornek's works playfully engage with the strange paradoxes and convergences of life in the age of the Anthropocene, that new geological epoch in which the effects of capitalism, colonialism, and exploitation are inscribed in the materiality of the earth. With her installations at the interface of art and scientific research, she makes the complex interconnections of nature and culture visible and tangible.

Elisabeth Schäfer is a philosopher at the Department of Philosophy at the University of Vienna, where she has been teaching since 2010, and at the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna. Her research and teaching interests are: Deconstruction, Queer-Feminist Philosophy, Écriturefeminine, Writing as Artistic Research, Performance Philosophy. She continuously conducts lectures, lecture performances, interventions, etc. Together with Tanja Traxler, Elisabeth Schäfer is working on the research project "Critical Contact Zones. Exploring the Entanglement of Art, Science, Philosophy, and Society in Climate Change".

Alexander Kerlin, has been a dramaturg at the Burgtheater since 2019. During his studies, he and fellow students founded the independent group kainkollektiv, with which he realized a dozen theater projects in the Ruhr region between 2004 and 2012. Between 2010 and 2019 Kerlin was dramaturg at Schauspiel Dortmund, and in 2014 Kerlin received the NRW Förderpreis for young artists for his work. He is co-founder of the Dortmund Academy for Theater and Digitality, which began its work in 2019. With the plays *Die Borderline Prozession* (director: Kay Voges) and *Das Internat* (director: Ersan Mondtag) Kerlin was invited twice to the Berlin Theatertreffen, both productions were created under his co-authorship.

Installation & talk accompanying the performance Tattooing the Earth

In the context of the talk *De-romanticizing nature*, the author and philosopher **Fahim Amir** and the media cultural scientist **Nanna Heidenreich** talk about opportunities for new concepts of coexistence and counterexistence along the lines of combative animals and so-called invasive species.

Fahim Amir is a philosopher and author living in Vienna. He is concerned with the transitions between natural cultures and urbanism, art and utopia, colonial historicity and modernism. He has worked with artists* such as Chicks on Speed, Deichkind, Ted Gaier, and Rocko Schamoni and wrote the afterword to the German translation of Donna Haraway's *Manifesto for Companions* (Merve, 2016). His book *Schwein und Zeit* was honored with the Austrian Karl Marx Prize, was on the nonfiction bestseller lists of Deutschlandfunk Kultur, ZDF, and Die Zeit, and was chosen as one of the best books of 2019 by the Goethe-Institut and the Frankfurt Book Fair.

Nanna Heidenreich is a media culture scholar and professor for transcultural studies at the University of Applied Arts Vienna and curator. She has worked as a curator for Forum Expanded / Berlinale, ADKDW Cologne and HKW Berlin, among others, and realized the project "Expiring Environments" (together with Marcus Held) for Kunstverein D21 in Leipzig. Numerous publications in the field of critical migration research, visual culture, postcolonial theory, politics/art/cinema, other cinema (feminist, queer, experimental). She was part of the organizing network for the tribunal"NSU-Komplex auflösen" (Cologne 2017). Her main topics include migration and marine research.

Anna Laner, dramaturg and director. From 2015 to 2019 she worked as a dramaturg at Schauspielhaus Wien. Since 2019 she works freelance in collaboration with Elke Auer, Eva Jantschitsch & Matthias Köhler and for numerous theatres like Schauspiel Stuttgart or Landestheater Marburg. In addition, she has been co-curating the season program at Kosmos Theater Vienna since 2020.


