

MEDIUM is a ghost performance in which Núria Guiu dances to the music of Stephen O'Malley/SUNN O))). The performance is about how the body is haunted by movements emerging from personal, cultural and virtual archives. The ghost is partly a metaphor for movements from different times and dimensions that return and take up residence in our bodies, but it is also understood as the act of creating in itself, from the invisible realm to its physical manifestation in a performance.

In *MEDIUM*, Núria Guiu dances to music by Stephen O'Malley/SUNN O))). The performance looks at how the body is haunted by ghosts of the past, present, and future. Here, the ghost is understood both as a metaphor for how different movement histories and physical memes are manifested in the body, but also concretely through dances that seek to channel actual ghosts or spirits. In Western Modernity, the conception of humanity has been based on a distinction between human and nature, but also on a disenchantment of the world where ghosts and spirits no longer had a place. In recent years, the post-humanist turn has tried to re-include other-than-humans and to re-entangle the human being as someone who is always already in relationship. However, this entanglement tends to favour the natural world and there is more reluctancy to consider the supernatural. *MEDIUM* aims to negotiate the universes of the visible and the invisible, of materiality and volatility, spirit and flesh in order to question this threefold of the body as both natural and cultural – as a channel for the supernatural.

Ingri Midgard Fiksdal is a choreographer based in Oslo, Norway. In 2019, she finished a PhD in artistic research at Oslo National Academy of the Arts titled Affective Choreographies. Ingri's work on affect has in recent years taken her into discourses on perspective and privilege. She is currently working on a number of projects addressing the intersection between the post-anthropocentric and the decolonial from a feminist perspective in the context of CoFutures at the University of Oslo where she is an Affiliated Artistic Reseracher. Ingri is concerned with how practise and theory are entangled in her work in a way where neither is perceived as anterior to the other. Ingri's work has in recent years been performed at Kunstenfestival in Brussels, Palais de Tokyo in Paris, Museum of Contemporary Art in Chicago, Santarcangelo festival, Beijing Contemporary Dance Festival, Sommerszene in Salzburg, Reykjavík Art Museum, brut Wien, Teatro di Roma, Harbourfront Centre Toronto, Contemporary Art Center Cincinnati, BUDA Kortrijk, Tanzhaus NRW in Düsseldorf and Steirischer Herbst Festival in Graz, alongside extensive touring in Norway.

Núria Guiu is an artist living in Barcelona. She has a degree in classical dance, is a certified Yoga Iyengar teacher and student of Anthropology and Human Evolution at the UOC University (Bcn). As a dancer, she has worked with companies such as Cullberg Ballet, Gisèle Vienne, Carte Blanche Dance Company, Batsheva Dance Company (Kamuyot/Riksteatern), Ingri Fiksdal, Jasmin Vardimon, La Veronal, Kobalt Works and others. As a choreographer, she created a piece for Carte Blanche Dance Company (*La Muda*) in 2012, her solo *Portal* in collaboration with Norwegian musician Gisle Martens Meyer, premiered at Oktoberdans 2014, and her last solo piece *Likes*, selected by the European platform Aerowaves 2018, which won a special mention for best dance performance at the "Premis ciutat de Barcelona 2018" and a prize for best solo dance performance at the "Premis de la crítica 2018 Barcelona". She has worked as artistic assistant of Gisèle Vienne as well as performer in some of her creations.

Ronak Moshtaghi (costume designer) is a visual artist based in Oslo and Berlin. She makes sculptures, paintings and installations. Ronak has a continuous collaboration with the choreographer Roza Moshtaghi as an artist and scenographer. In 2018 together with the artist Hedieh Ahmadi she founded the BAZAR Art Book Fair in Tehran. Ronak is born in Tehran, educated in Tehran University of Art and Oslo National Academy of Art. She has been exhibiting at Kunsthall Oslo, Louise Dany, Destiny's and Intercultural Museum in Oslo, The Mosaic rooms in London and Lajevardi Foundation, Tehran.

Stephen O'Malley (musician, composer) sometimes referred to as SOMA is an American guitarist, producer, composer and visual artist from Seattle, Washington, who has conceptualized and participated in numerous drone doom, death/doom, and experimental music bands, most notably Sunn O))).


